## CO-PRINCIPALS' MESSAGE

**Nau mai hoki mai - welcome back to kindergarten & school!!!  
Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou e te whānau whānui,  
dear parents, families, and friends.**

Last week, akomanga tuawhā (Class 4) presented their class play to whānau, friends and the school, and even squeezed in a special performance for the tamariki of our Raumati South kindergartens. This play told the story of Rata and the Tree, a traditional pūrakau (Māori legend or story) beautifully scripted by Paul Fletcher, and presented with great connection and enthusiasm by the tamariki. For me, this was an opportunity to be there firstly as a parent, but also as a colleague and teacher.



As a parent, it was great to see the enthusiasm, the collaboration and support that the students bring to their work. As parents, plays often give that opportunity to see our children in a new way – to see their growing capacity, confidence and self-awareness. Other parents were equally impressed by the way their children spoke with such confidence, even those that are often quiet and reserved in their daily life. Kia kaha tamariki ma!

As a colleague, I know the huge amount of work that goes into preparing a play - finding (or writing!) a script, preparing props and costumes, as well as all the mahi of practising with the students. This is another aspect of holding a class that Paul has stepped into this year – Paul's role has been larger than what he originally signed up for, and he has done it all with characteristic grace and skill! Tēnā koe Paul. Nga mihi nui ki a koe!

Class plays are one part of school that the students always seem to value and enjoy. Sports, festivals and Te wiki o te mahi tahi are others – make sure you check the diary of dates to see when these are approaching! All of these great events rely on volunteers and on teachers being willing to take on extra tasks. I have a lot of gratitude for being part of our community and for all these wonderful opportunities that our students have.

## WHĀNAU TEACHER INTERVIEWS - BOOKINGS STILL OPEN



It's so important that parents and teachers take time to build a shared picture of each child and student! If you have not done so yet, please take advantage of these meetings. Information on how to make bookings was sent out by class teachers via email. Please note that to avoid teacher-overload, we ask that there is one 15-20 minutes meeting for each child. If additional time is required this can be arranged with the class teacher.

## COMING SOON: ERO Evaluation Partnership @ Te Rā

The Education Review Office (Te Tari Arotake Matauranga) is the government's external evaluation agency for schools, kura, kohanga reo, puna reo, and early childhood services. In the past, ERO teams used to visit schools for 2-3 days and provide a report based on their findings, thus providing a "snapshot evaluation", usually followed by a set of recommendations for areas of improvement. The rest was up to the school ... until the next ERO visit a few years later, generally.

Since last year, ERO have been shifting to a more developmental approach to evaluation in order to effectively support school improvement. This means that each school will have an ERO evaluation partner who will work alongside, building a professional relationship over time. ERO's evaluation role will connect with each school's strategic planning and reporting cycle as part of an ongoing improvement journey.

It has always been extremely important for us that our ERO visitors are able to have a full understanding of our special character curriculum and pedagogy as well as of our community and of our whānau's aspirations for their children's education. Having been part with a number of ERO visits over the years, I know that this kind of picture-building is not easy to achieve over a few days! The new model, with its broad timeframe, will be much more supportive of that.

Later this term, we will welcome Te Rā School's evaluation partner, Ruth Nicholas. Our initial meeting will focus on building relationships, helping us to better understand the new evaluation process, and then sharing what we see as the school's strengths, challenges and priorities. For us, this feels like perfect timing as we are in the process of developing the new Strategic Plan 2022-2024 this term.

We'll keep you in posted!

## PLEDGE UPDATE

For 2021, our budget for Special Character pledge is \$512,000 (this is portioned percentage of the full amount that was pledged).

At the end of July \$278,000 had been paid towards SCC pledge. This was 54.29% of the pledge and slightly over the expected amount. Thank you for your ongoing commitment to paying the pledge on regular basis.



The ongoing commitment of the payment of pledge provides the Trust with confidence in our budgeting levels and provides assurance that they are able to meet all the commitments to the Board of Trustees (and this ultimately means the children and staff) that they made at the beginning of the year.

## Biodiversity and Childhood Health Study (Massey University) - reminder

Just before the term break the office sent home an information pack about this interesting project to whānau of children aged 6 and over, via child mail. Our school board was provided with a lot of information about this prior and is in support of the study's kaupapa. Perhaps the results will support the creation of natural environments around all schools in this country!



Of course, it is completely up to each family to decide if they are interested in participating in this study. Te Rā School has no involvement other than to distribute the information to our community and we do not share information about our students with Massey University or individual researchers at any point during this research. Please note that if you do not wish to participate, you do not need to opt out or respond.

## Here is a message from the Massey team:

---

Researchers at Massey University are studying how the natural environment affects health in children. The aim of the study is to find out if exposure to greater plant biodiversity may protect against several health conditions including, asthma and allergies.

If your child is **6-11 years old**, the research team would be grateful if you would consider taking part. For this study we need all children - including those who do and those who do not have asthma and allergies.

The study involves completing a questionnaire and your child taking part in a breathing and an allergy test. A smaller number of selected participants will be invited to take part in a second phase of the study, which would involve some further health tests.

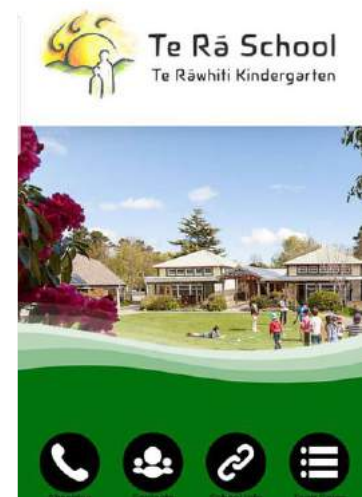
