Vacancy: Kindergarten Kaiārahi/Centre Manager (full-time, permanent)

We are looking for an enthusiastic and flexible person to manage our established kindergarten, lead our committed kindergarten teaching team and engage with our supportive whānau.

Te Rāwhiti Kindergarten has two kindergarten locations on the Kāpiti Coast, (Raumati and Paekākāriki) 45 minutes from Wellington, with up to 80 children on the roll. Te Rāwhiti Kindergarten is part of Te Rā Waldorf School, a state-integrated, Waldorf primary school. It is a licenced early childhood centre, aligning with the Te Whāriki Early Childhood Curriculum. As a Waldorf kindergarten, it is part of Te Rāwhiti's special character to provide a nurturing and unhurried early childhood experience for our children, letting them blossom in their world of fantasy and imagination which they explore through play, thus supporting their individual development, well-being and resilience. The kindergarten Kaiārahi/Manager will be a part of the combined senior management team of kindergarten and school (www.tera.school.nz), and part of the whole teaching faculty.

This role requires a wide range of experience and skills, including:

- In-depth professional knowledge and experience as a registered teacher in the early childhood setting
- Leadership and management experience and skills
- Knowledge of and/or commitment to learn about our special character and Waldorf pedagogy
- Knowledge of and/or commitment to learn about te Tiriti o Waitangi and bi-cultural practice

Nau mai haere mai: ERO @ Te Rā

On Tuesday, we welcomed our new ERO Evaluation Partner, Ruth Nicholas, with a Mihi Whakatau. After kai we took Ruth for a quick tour around the school before settling down for a meeting. For this initial hui, Kerstin and David were joined by Michael Freeman and Matt Lamason for the school board,

The Education Review Office has recently changed their process, which can now span a 1 to 3 year "partnership" during which Ruth will work alongside us. The initial hui was an opportunity for Ruth to meet the team and share the plan for the months ahead, and it was an opportunity for us to listen and to ask questions.

Here is what ERO has to say about its new approach:

Schools have told us that our previous approach hasn't worked well: we have heard, listened, and have developed the new operating model as a result.

We are moving from a 'one-size-fits-all' approach with reviews that are a point in time to an approach based on your school's individual needs. This approach is built on a relationship focused on helping your school make improvements in the areas that deliver the greatest improvements to learner success.

We are committed to supporting improved outcomes and achieving equity for all learners, particularly Māori and priority learners. The principles that underpin the new model give priority to the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi through a focus on partnerships to achieve desired outcomes.

The model has a focus on understanding the cultural context of each school in order to best serve its needs. By building differentiation into the model, we have given ourselves the flexibility to work with the wider community where it is desired and appropriate. We're committed to continuing to work with the sector. This will require goodwill and professionalism from all.

We work differently with each school/kura according to its context, culture and needs.

We work with you to evaluate how well things are going in your school/kura, then we help you to use the findings to decide your improvement plans and actions. We support you to develop your internal evaluation practice to evaluate and report on your own progress.

How much and how often we work with you will reflect your strengths and focus for improvement.

We work with you over time

We assist you to align these external and internal evaluation activities and findings to your three-year cycle for strategic planning and reporting, internal evaluation and continuous improvement.

Our evaluators work with you as an evaluation partner throughout the evaluation and in the ongoing evaluation relationship with your school/kura.

Our evaluation approach is based on your participation and framed by Te Tiriti o Waitangi

As we work with you in the Evaluation for Improvement process, we are committed to the Māori concepts of:

- *Whakawhanaungatanga: Supporting each other to grow and learn*
- *Mahi tahi: Doing the best for each other*
- *Poutokomanawa: High-quality trusted evaluation for improvement.*

We work together with the people in your school and community who participate by designing, and doing the evaluation, and using the findings.

Other people will be able to participate by giving their views, perspectives and information.

We enjoyed our initial hui with Ruth and look forward to beginning this journey together!


