<p>Majority of staff and students on site</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Individual students required to work at home use materials from home-learning packs distributed earlier. ● For them, Parent/tuakana/whānau support is required as teachers continue to teach their normal classes. 	<p>Growing numbers of teachers across the school are absent</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Te Rā will start offering a mixture of home-based and onsite learning ● Content of on-site learning will differ from home-learning content ● Staff/Teacher responsibilities will require flexibility ● Relieving and specialist teachers maybe required for teaching purposes 	<p>Large numbers of students absent</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Most staff available to support models of learning ● The staff, in consultation with the Board, will decide to implement home-based Learning programmes ● Students at school will follow the home-based learning programme regardless of whether they are at home or at school ● Priority for students being supervised on the school site will be given to children of essential/critical workers 	<p>Majority of staff and students are absent</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Health and Safety risks due to not enough staff available on-site ● No longer possible for teachers to support home-based learning alongside on-site supervision. ● Ministry of Education, in consultation with the Board, decides to shut the school. Where possible, teachers continue to support learning remotely.
