MESSAGE TO OUR COMMUNITY

We have been blessed in so many ways this week! And at this time more than at any other time you might find that "counting blessings" is simply the best way to imbue the young generation whom we nurture with faith in the future and trust in the mysterious workings of the universe.



At this time we continue to be grateful for everything you are doing to make it easier for all of us working here at Te Rāwhiti and Te Rā: like automatically scanning and signing in (except for kindergarten drop offs and pick ups), wearing a mask (unless you are exempt), maintaining recommended distances when meeting others outside the gate, and only coming on-site if this is absolutely necessary, e.g. to settle your child in the morning ... all this goes a long way for us right now.

At our regular hui yesterday afternoon, our teaching staff shared with each other our "golden moments" of the first days back with the children. There were so many both from kindergarten and school! Unexpected silver linings of the changes were among them. For example, we heard about the instant and deep connections that new Class 1 children and their Class 7 buddies were able to form on the first day. The change to our usual pōwhiri and Class 1 ceremony meant that our tuakana and our teina could spend much more "quality time" together than usual. Class 7 really stepped up to the responsibility with great maturity and made all of us very proud!

Another "silver lining" is the number of outdoor lessons happening within our gardens and grounds. It is a joy to see the "classrooms without walls". I hope you enjoy the snapshots included in this newsletter. We are constantly reviewing our outdoor spaces with a view to improving and extending them, depending on the school's needs.

COVID-19

Misinformation about COVID-19 Vaccination in Schools

It has been brought to the attention of the local schools that there are rumours circulating within our school communities in regard to children being vaccinated at schools. These rumours have no substance and are causing undue anxieties for many parents and caregivers. To clarify for our own community:

- There are no plans to run vaccination programmes for children at Te Rā School. The school board agreed a while back to not grant permission of our grounds or buildings being used for any form of vaccination.
- There is a story circulating that the government is organising a "vaccination bus" to turn up at schools and vaccinate all the children without parental permission. We have been reassured there are no such plans.

If you come across anyone who holds these concerns, please ask them to contact our office for reassurance.

Covid-19 information for school: updates only (existing information can be found on our website)

Heads up re **school sports** ... as a result of having moved into Red, we are reviewing whether, if any, interschool sports can go ahead. With most local schools indicating they will not go ahead with Touch Rugby, we believe it is the right thing to follow their lead. This decision could be an indication that we will need to make a similar decision for netball and hockey - we will keep you posted!

Besides the issue of managing the restrictions and more complex logistics of operating these in Red, there is also the issue of unpredictable numbers of staff and parents available to support these sports (team managers, coaches, transport, umpiring ...) over the next months.

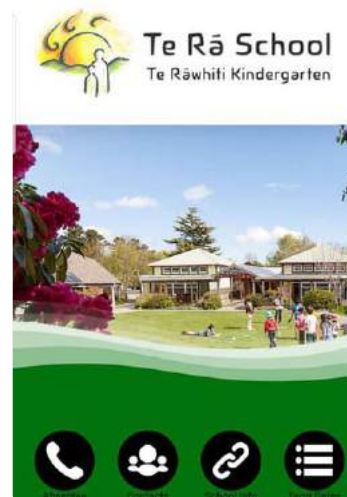
