

## Class 2 Blackboard: The Story of Parikhaka



At the beginning of the October term break many of us had the privilege of attending a two day workshop "Te Pumaomao Nationbuilding" with Takawai and Chris Murphy. In a nutshell - it was amazing! We felt so lucky to access Ministry of Education funding to run this PLD at our school, and teachers were joined by some colleagues from kindergarten and the office as well as by representatives of our school board and our proprietor's trust.

Takawai and Chris took us on a journey of experiencing the impact of colonisation on tangata whenua, with humour and sensitivity, through information and role play, and challenged us to create goals for our professional practice.

The school teachers have been working towards implementing the refreshed Aotearoa NZ Histories curriculum next year and chose to focus on creating teaching resources for the story of Parihaka. This would be in form of a new Main Lesson for senior classes that explores the historical events and an age appropriate discourse on "justice".

It also inspired the story of the courageously peaceful people of Parihaka told as part of the Class 2 Main Lesson "Saints and Good People", with Parihaka's prophets Te Whiti o Rongomai and Tohu Kākahi living out the truth and love of their faith. And it inspired a special assembly on Parihaka Day, 5 November, where the school classes gathered in the hall to remember, celebrate and acknowledge the non-violence of the people of Parihaka through story and waiata.
