

Health & Safety Policy

Rationale:

To ensure safe, healthy and hygienic practices are upheld in order to promote the health and safety of tamariki, kaiako and staff while at kindergarten. This policy is written in line with: the requirements of the Ministry of Education Licensing Criteria: HS1, HS12-15, HS24, Education (ECS) Regulations 2008: 46 and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.

Te Whāriki:

Well-being/Mana atua: Tamariki experience an environment where they are kept safe from harm.

Procedures:

Responsibilities

- 1. Governance and management are responsible for providing and maintaining:
 - a) A safe working environment.
 - b) Safe systems of work that prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill-health by managing health and safety risks in the workplace.
 - c) Equipment in safe condition.
 - d) Facilities for the welfare of all staff.
 - e) Engagement and consultation with employees on day-to day health and safety conditions.
 - f) Clear instructions, information, and adequate training, to employees, contractors, and volunteers to ensure they are competent to do their work safely regarding health and safety.
 - g) Holding up-to-date, readily available emergency details for each tamaiti, kaiako and the school's emergency response team.
 - h) Notifying necessary agencies, such as Worksafe, Regional Public Health and the Ministry of Education, of any serious injury, illness, or incidents, as required.
- 2. Kaiako & staff are responsible for:
 - a) Ensuring their own personal health and safety, to ensure that they are fit to work with tamariki in line with the Early Childhood Regulations, 2008.
 - b) Complying with any reasonable directions given by governance and management for health and safety.
 - c) Participating in health and safety training and ensuring they know, understand, and implement all health and safety related policies and procedures.
 - d) Keeping accurate and up-to-date records in the accident, illness, incident and medicine registers.
 - e) Holding up-to-date and readily available emergency details for each tamaiti.
- 3. All people who are regular visitors to the kindergarten are expected to:
 - a) Be familiar with Te Rāwhiti Kindergarten health and safety related policies.
 - b) Report any hazards, incidents, or accidents they see to management.

Health and Safety Coordination



- 4. A Health and Safety Coordinator will be nominated in February of each year and is responsible for:
 - a) Managing medical supplies, including ordering and budget;
 - b) Managing the spaces for sick tamariki to ensure that cleanliness and hygiene of the cabinets, supplies, and sick beds;
 - c) Checking the Accident and Illness Registers each term and identifying and investigating any health and safety issues;
 - d) Overseeing all major incidents until completed;
 - e) Supporting staff to manage day-to-day issues (if necessary);
 - f) Managing the correct procedures for dealing with medicines and safe storage;
 - g) Overseeing the accurate completion of the accident, illness, incident and medicine registers and ensuring they are kept up-to-date.
- 5. All Kaiako receive up-to-date first aid training. The kindergarten will have at least one first aid qualified person present for every 25 tamariki attending at all times.
- 6. Records are kept in the form of accident, illness, incident and medicine reports.
- 7. Earthquake, fire and civil defence drills and strategies are in place. See Emergency Procedure Policy for kindergarten.

Hazard Identification & Elimination

- 8. In managing risk effectively, all staff take every precaution to ensure tamariki, other staff and visitors are safe from harm. This includes reporting any unforeseen risks to the kindergarten kaiārahi.
- 9. Kaiako check the grounds, both indoors and outdoors, at the beginning of each day for hazards using the Daily Hazard Checks (below) and any cause for concern is reported to the kaiārahi. The hazard is then analysed by the kaiārahi and/or caretaker who decide on appropriate action in order to swiftly eliminate, isolate or minimise the risk. All identified hazards are recorded in the Hazard and Risk Management Register (below) by the kaiārahi.
- 10. Any staff member who has identified a risk has a duty to take reasonable care and is required by the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 (SSWA 2015) to take immediate actions to manage, isolate or eliminate the risk and will notify the kaiārahi immediately.
- 11. Each kindergarten class has a copy of the Hazard and Risk Management Register, filed within the operations folder located in each kindergarten room. The register includes identified hazards, risk assessment, and ongoing management strategies.
- 12. Accidents/incidents of tamariki are recorded on the accident register and parents are asked to site and sign this. Kaiako are responsible for identifying hazards from these accidents/incidents and notifying the kaiārahi.

Premises

- 13. Te Rāwhiti kindergarten employs a cleaner who thoroughly cleans the premises at the end of each day of operation (cleaning schedule below).
- 14. Poisons and hazardous chemicals/materials are not accessible to tamariki.
- 15. There is a separate space, aside from kitchen and bathrooms, for the preparation and cleaning up of paint and other art materials.
- 16. Civil Defence Kits are checked and restocked as necessary every 12 months.
- 17. Kitchen and cooking facilities are designed to prevent tamariki from unsupervised access and will be locked at all times during session.



- 18. A maintenance record is kept by the caretaker who will record every repair and maintenance job done on any land, building, and piece of equipment.
- 19. Heavy furniture, fixtures and equipment that could fall or topple and cause serious injury or damage are secured.
- 20. Rooms used by tamariki are kept at a comfortable temperature, no lower than 18°C during licensed hours.
- 21. Tempering valves have been installed to ensure the water temperature on taps accessible to tamariki are no hotter than 40°C and comfortable for their use. Hot water cylinders store water at minimum 60°C to avoid unwanted bacterial growth.
- 22. Environments have been adapted to ensure noise levels do not interfere with normal speech and/or commutation or cause distress or harm to any of the tamariki.
- 23. A bleach solution of 1 part bleach and 10 (10ml bleach 100ml H2O 1:10) parts water will be used on high-risk surfaces i.e. nappy change areas and toilets. For surfaces where kai is prepared or eaten, environmentally friendly disinfectant is used to sanitize surfaces.
- 24. All spray bottles are labeled clearly, indicating their contents.
