

## **Hygienic Laundering Procedure**

## Rationale:

To ensure safe and hygienic practices are upheld in line with Ministry of Education Licensing Criteria HS2: Linen used by children or adults is hygienically laundered.

## Te Whāriki:

Well-being/Mana Atua: Tamariki experience an environment where they are kept safe from harm.

## **Procedures:**

- 1. The kindergarten's washing machine will be used by kaiako to run hot washes, using hyperallergenic washing powder, throughout the week for kindergarten linen. Separate washes will be done for:
  - a) Kitchen linen
  - b) Bathroom or body linen
  - c) Art and play linen.
- 2. Once washed, linen will be sufficiently dried by air drying or the use of a dryer. Linen will then be put away in its appropriate place once fully dry.
- 3. Teachers will ensure children are offered clean linen to use whenever needed, including bedding, cloths and towels.
- 4. All soiled and sick children's clothing will be placed into a plastic bag to be sent home with the child's whānau for washing.
- 5. If any kindergarten linen, such as spare clothing, is soiled, teachers will wash it immediately and separately in a hot wash. In the case of soiling by blood, a cold wash, followed by a hot wash is required.

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
