MESSAGE TO OUR COMMUNITY

He taonga rongonui te aroha ki te tangata - Goodwill towards others is a precious treasure.

Amidst the joyful and happy times late summer days are offering us here on the Kāpiti Coast, our thoughts are with those affected by the floods caused by the cyclone Gabrielle in other parts of our country. Our thoughts are with those who lost houses, belongings, jobs, livelihoods and lives, and also with those of us here who are affected indirectly, with loved ones in the areas. We have heard from most of the Waldorf schools and kindergartens in the affected regions, and most seem to be able to operate with as much normality as possible, given the



circumstances. As parents and as educators we all know that when life is turbulent, the rythms and routines of kindergarten and school provide stability and reassurance. We know that any of our colleagues who themselves are impacted by the cyclone will do what teachers and support staff always do in times of crisis: leave personal worries at the school gate and focus on the children in front of them.

Here at Te Rāwhiti and Te Rā are blessed with a community that supports others, and each other. In the wake of Cyclone Gabrielle, communities like ours are digging deep into their own resources - material and otherwise - and of course it is also on us to do our bit for them, as best we can.

At this point, everyone is aware that donations of money are the best form of support. Affected communities can use your donations on their priorities, which will be different in different areas. Habits, good practices and a friendly request ...

Last Thursday morning, we had 32 children late for school last Thursday morning, and another 15 who arrived in the first 10 minutes after the bell and narrowly avoided the late slip. That's almost a third of our school roll. Fortunatly, that's not usually the picture and perhaps a "record" of sorts.



Arriving late and in a rush is never great for anyone, let alone a child (or teen) who wants to catch up with friends before school, and perhaps fit in a game or two. It takes a whole family effort to make it possible that school children arrive with enough time for that, between 8.30 and 8.45, which gives them at least 10 minutes before the bell.

On the other hand, if you are in a classic morning rush occasionally and it would cause major stress to make it in time - it's absolutely fine to be late sometimes, of course. Just not as a rule - we would not want a child think that school is something where it doesn't matter whether you are on time or not.

You child's class teacher will be ever so greatful to start the day with a full morning circle rather than a small pond that is slowly filling up as children trickle in one by one.

classroom, whether that's through listening to their teacher sharing a story or telling one themselves to their class mates.


If your child is sick please let your kindergarten teacher know. Please remember with the weather being changeable to include a spare set of clothes and wet weather gear in their bags.

- SCHOOL PĀNUI -

2023 Changes to Assessment & Reporting (Classes 1-7)

Over the last years, starting with the curriculum area of mathematics, teachers have been reviewing how to carry out assessments and track student learning and achievement in ways that are more suited to tracking individual progress. We made a decision to shift to a new way of reporting student achievement to parents. As a school, we are fortunate to have relationships with other schools who have moved in the same direction, and we can learn from what has worked for them (and also from what hasn't, of course).

We believe that this is an exciting change that will enhance learning and teaching at Te Rā School.



For some years now we (teachers, school leaders & board members) have been wondering how we can better capture individual progress in a way that also informs how teachers can plan ahead to meet the needs of individual students that they know so well, in a much more wholesome way than could ever be captured by tests or benchmarks.

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN FOR PARENTS, CAREGIVERS AND WIDER WHĀNAU?

Instead of reporting to whānau in the middle and end of the year, teachers will meet to discuss learning and wellbeing with whānau of their students in Terms 1 and 3. The hui be followed up by a brief written summary. These summaries form part of a progress report into which teachers and whānau have input.

For Term 1, Teachers will shortly send out schedules to book individual Partnership Hui with parents/caregivers (and any whānau members you would like to bring) on the following days:

Class 7 only

Thursday 9 March between 11.15am and 4pm

Classes 1-6

Wednesday 15 March - from 12.30pm (session times will vary between classes) Wednesday 22 March - from 12.30 pm (session times will vary between classes)

- Please note that on these two Wednesdays, normal lessons will finish at midday and students
 from Class 1-6 can be picked up. If this is not possible, specialist teachers, support staff and
 Class 7 students will team up to supervise students who cannot go home during this time.
- School is as per usual timetable on 9 March.
- Kindergarten sessions are not affected at all on either day.

At the end of the year, whanau will receive an year report by email.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT UPDATE

When Cyclone Gabrielle was approaching Auckland a few weeks ago, the administration team met to review our emergency management plan.

We have taken the opportunity to update our processes and have full plans in place for the following circumstances:

- 1. Carpark/pedestrian egress flooding traffic and pedestrian management plan
- 2. North or South road closures plan in place if roads are closed north and south. Communication will come direct from the office to families affected. Food is available on site for children and there is a plan in place for overnight stay if required.
- 3. Full Evacuation if a full evacuation is required, we will move to Raumati South School. The processes around this have been well thought through to ensure clear communication to teachers and support staff, and to ensure the children stay calm and safe.

While it is important to have a plan, it is one of those things that hopefully we never have to use. Our likely scenario is flooding in our carpark due to abnormal rainfall, with traffic management and staggered pickups if required.

The office will use SchoolApp notifications and email to communicate any emergency information. If you do not have a smart phone, please let the office know so we can contact you in a different way.

Please download and/or update your child's class groups now. Search for SchoolAppsNZ, once downloaded added Te Ra School. This is for School and Kindergarten families.

If you would like to view a copy of our processes, they can be viewed in the office. As they are a Health and Safety document, we will not be making changes unless agreed by teachers and we feel it is an improvement to ensure the well being of the children.
